

Dear Disciples in Christ,

It's that time of year, when sunset comes a bit later in the day, when the temperatures slowly begin to rise, and the ground begins to thaw. The farmers will be taking advantage of the warmer weather and the spring thaw and begin to turn over the soil in their fields. And while the calendar says we still have many days until Spring, the earth is busy preparing itself.

It's also that time in the church calendar, when we are in a time of preparation. We're in the midst of a season called Lent, which comes from an Old English word "lencten" or "lengthen", meaning "Spring", when the days grow longer. And so during this season of Lent, we use this time to clear the clutter from our hearts, doing all that is necessary to prepare them to receive the Word of Life, which is a living Word, that we may continue to bear fruit, fruit that will last for the building up of God's Kingdom here on earth.

One of the greatest seeds being planted here at St. John is the love of God's Word in our Going Deeper Bible Studies. Watching how the Word of God comes alive each week, as different people take on the lesson and share it in their small group (whether in person or via some form of technology), is a joy to see. Seeing so many people willing to gather together to learn from one another, pray with one another, and bless each other on our way, is a seed planted that will bear a harvest of rich fruit over many years to come.

I encourage you all, to continue to gather together in as many ways as you can around God's Word, whether in worship, small Bible Study groups, men and women's groups, youth studies and family prayer.

Let this Lent be a time of continued preparation for the bearing of new fruit in Christ.



Wednesday services are held at noon and 6:15 pm through March 24.

Many Christians around the world give up certain things for the forty days of Lent and doing so can be a very beneficial thing. Our Lenten series this year takes that idea one step further and looks each week at things that God wants us to give up, not just for forty days, but for a lifetime. Join us!

GIVING UP CONTROL: Adam and Eve disobeyed God, thinking that they knew better than him, with disastrous consequences.

GIVING UP EXPECTATIONS: Abraham followed God's call to leave his homeland and travel to the place God promised his descendants, even though he didn't know how it would all work out.

GIVING UP SUPERIORITY: Jesus broke all kinds of social conventions by speaking to a woman in public, a Samaritan no less, whose own life was such a mess that it could have really messed up Jesus' reputation as a holy man to others. If we let go of our status symbols and judgmental attitudes, we too can hear Jesus' call more clearly and respond more faithfully.

GIVING UP ENEMIES: Loving our enemies can sometimes feel like as idealistic a notion as instantaneous world peace, but Jesus showed us that caring even for those who persecute you is a real, actionable mandate that we can carry out by following Jesus' example.

GIVING UP OUR LIVES: God creates life from death, nothingness, and hopelessness. Embrace God's larger vision of eternal life that begins here and now.

BEACONS AND QUILTERS NEWS



When we start meeting again, come and check out the Beacons and Quilters. We will start meeting again when the county is yellow or orange on the covid map. You may visit for just a bit and then go on your way. If you want to visit longer, bring your lunch and stay for a couple of hours. You may visit once a month if you don't want to commit to coming every Tuesday. If you would rather do your work at your home, we have material for you to select to make a quilt at home to donate to Franklin County Children's Services or the Bed Brigade. We have other activities that do not involve working with fabric. We do stamps and cards any Tuesday. A visit is not a commitment.

If you have essential furniture items and you do not have the means to transport them to a donation/collection site, consider the non-profit charity, Furniture Bank. They will come and pick up your furniture. To qualify for free pickup, furniture must be on the front porch or in the garage. Inside

pickup is a \$25 fee. The Furniture Bank gives furniture to the needy. Their number is 614-272-9544. Their address is 118 South Yale Avenue, Columbus, Ohio 43222. Furniture needs to be free of pet hair. During non-covid time, the Furniture Bank has groups of woodworkers who make dressers, beds, and tables for those in need of furniture to make a home.

One Grove City charity that accepts used clothing in March is the Grove City Methodist Church Purple Door Free Store. Their address and phone are 2684 Columbus Street, Grove City, Ohio 43123 and 614-875-5612. The Methodist Church has an easy drop-off site inside their church. The drop-off site is on the northeast side of the church with the canopy/portico. Park under the canopy/portico for easier unloading. You will probably be there less than 5 minutes. Go through the double doors and go to the left. There are even door-opening-assist levers to press if your arms are full and you can't manage the doors. The drop-off signs and containers are on the left. This is usually an unmanned, drop-and-go procedure. The drop off times have changed due to volunteer scheduling and space availability. The drop-off times are Sunday from 8am to noon and Wednesday from 6pm to 8pm. There are no drop offs other than listed. Only clothing and shoes are accepted. The Beacons no longer sort and take used clothing to Faith Mission.

The Quilters meet every Tuesday from 9am to 2pm in rooms 103-104. The Beacons meet with the Quilters on the third Tuesday to help with projects and attend the monthly meeting. Bring a sack lunch. All materials are provided. At the Beacons' meeting, we take offerings for the food pantries and for the Beacons' general fund.

JAYLYNN JERMANN confirmed her faith on September 27, 2020. Each student was asked to create a faith tri-fold. Below you'll see some excerpts of what Jaylynn wrote. *May God richly bless Jaylynn in her life with Christ, as she hopes and trusts in Him. Amen!*

(My God-sighting) About four years ago Magic, my cat, managed to slip outside. I was ion letting Freya, my dog, out so I didn't realize until later that night when I went to feed her

again. I was freaking out a bit because she could have gone anywhere and gotten hurt, but I also didn't know when she got out. My family and I looked everywhere in the neighborhood and couldn't find her. Around noon we let Freya out again and she kept barking and scratching trying to get under the shed. We took her in and to everyone's surprise Magic was under the shed. We pulled Magic out, gave her a bath, and put her down in the laundry room. At that moment I thought God sent Freya after Magic like that to help us find her. After that Magic would get out a few more times and the shed would be where we looked first.

My favorite Bible story is Noah's ark, which starts in Genesis 6. The story of Noah's journey starts when God sees His creation committing sins. He did not like to see what He created to be good becoming a sinful world, so He turned to Noah and His family. They were very faithful in God and trusted Him greatly. Because of their faith God told Noah to build a ship. Once the ship was complete, he was to take a female and male of every animal and put it on the ship along with him and his family. Today we know this as Noah's ark. Noah did as God told him and once the instructions were completed, God flooded the lands killing all the sin He saw before. The flood went on for forty days and nights. When the water vanished Noah started a new line of people and a new life. The reason I like this story is because it shows that if you are faithful to God, He will trust you to carry out the work He wants you to do.

My favorite service project is the Grove City Food Pantry. It's a place where people who can't afford food can go and obtain it. The confirmation class went to Aldi's and shopped for certain supplies. Usually we were given a list of two to three items per group. It was really fun because we had to get as much good supplies as we could with a limited amount of money. The last time we shopped, the line of carts we had went to the back of the store. Everybody's carts were filled with groceries. This is the kind of experience that you really just have to go and do to truly understand. My favorite part was dropping off the items because it was a really joyful experience seeing how happy the people were from getting the supplies. In the future I want to help others have the same experience I did.
