A Message from the Associate Pastor

"I thank God whom I serve with a clear conscience, as did my fathers, when I remember you constantly in my prayers. As I remember your tears, I long night and day to see you, That I may be filled with joy. I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and in your mother Eunice and now, I am sure dwells in you." 2 Timothy 1:3-5

Dear Disciples of Jesus,

St. Paul's last letter was written from prison to his younger friend Timothy. In it, he includes the above passage. Here's what we know about Timothy's background:

He was the child of a mixed marriage. His mother was Jewish and a believer, and his father was a Greek. We don't know anything more about the father. He may have been dead or deserted the family. We simply don't have that information.

Timothy knew the scriptures. He had the background he needed to become an apostle and companion of St. Paul as a missionary.

His teachers in the faith seem to have been his mother Eunice and his grandmother Lois. Paul also writes in 2 Timothy 3:15 *"From childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus."*

Timothy's mother and grandmother had not only explained the truth about God, but they had lived the truth as well.

In Paul's letters he mentions Timothy as co-author of six of them, and two others are written directly to Timothy. He was one of Paul's most important co-workers.

But enough about Timothy – I want to focus on those two women who played a crucial part in passing on to him the faith. Every child's very first teacher is his or her mother. Some of the rabbis insisted that girls should be given a basic education – not because they thought that as women, they needed the knowledge found in books. Rather they wanted mothers to have learning so that they could give their sons a head start in learning even before they started school.

Very few people come to the faith by listening to sermons, or by learning theology or reading books. Most of the people who find Jesus do so through a relationship with someone – friend, family member or neighbor. We see the gospel lived in the lives of those we love, and we come to share their faith. And for many of us – as for Timothy – the one who first drew us to Jesus was our mother.

I can't begin to tell you how important you who are mothers, or teachers, or grandmothers or favorite aunts have been in the spiritual formation and success of those who come after you. I see grandparents bringing young children to church and faithfully nurturing them in the ways of the Lord. I know my own grandmother played a key role in my own call to ministry, and after my husband's mother died when he was just two, it was left to his aunt and grandmother to raise him in the faith.

And while your children may be grown now and your grandchildren as well, your job is not done. You can still pray for them, as I'm sure Eunice and Lois prayed for Timothy when he was away on his missionary journeys with St. Paul. Through your love and faith, you can still be an example that draws them to God. And even when you are among the great cloud of witnesses, your influence will still linger on and bless them.

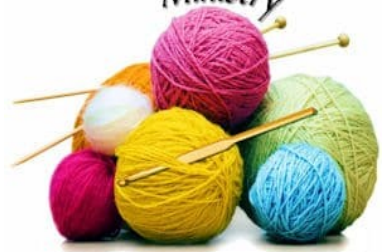
