Letter from the Pastor

Long ago, my favorite thing to do before bed was to sit at my computer and fly around the world on "Microsoft Flight Simulator." I've wanted to become a pilot my whole life. After a year or so of virtual flight, it struck me: the computer-generated illusion had become so engrossing that I was losing my desire to become a real pilot.

I know it sounds kind of science-fictiony, but through the past year, with the pandemic and all the bitter political conflict in our country, I keep having the weird feeling that our society is caught in a kind of simulation, unable to get hold of any substantive truth or reality. Powerful spiritual forces have been fragmenting us, driving individuals and groups towards isolation for a long time. Electronic media have done many wonderful things for us, but with social media and iPhones, and with people increasingly addicted to screens, it's also easier than ever to take cover behind barriers of physical distance and anonymity in our dealings with each other. We might be more connected to each other, but we're also farther apart than ever. Covid has only magnified the situation, pushing us farther apart while making the "connection" part uglier, a lot of the time.

For one thing, with the barriers of physical distance and anonymity in place, we don't have to take as much responsibility for what we say. When this is the case, our sinful nature oozes out. Instead of listening to each other and learning to deal with people who bother us, we're more quick to throw verbal bombs and wave political banners. It's become very hard to trust each other.

I have never been so thankful for God's Church in my life. When we come together as God's people, we aren't about waving our own banners or presenting ourselves as the sole keepers of final truth. Rather, before anything else, we're helping each other hear what the living Lord is trying to say to us through his Word, today. We're united in his mission, which cuts through all worldly divisions. Yes, we have different opinions about social issues, parenting, politics—we always will. But our Lord Jesus unites us under his banner of grace and forgiveness. As sinners who know we stand on nothing but his mercy, we treat each other with reverence and respect. We take the risk of listening carefully before we speak. We can allow ourselves to show our weakness, our brokenness, our vulnerability. This is where Jesus the Savior meets us: in our human reality. Thank God we don't have to be caught in the current simulation, where we are the (fictional) heroes of our own preferred storylines.

Times like the ones we're living in are not when faithful Christians retreat fearfully behind screens. Rather, this is when we can lift up Christ and His Church as the only chance for unity and true fellowship in a broken world.

Small groups—which include Sunday school classes and the faith webbing that Gary, Laurie and Diana are always doing with our young people—might not seem like a particularly revolutionary answer to the ugliness of our society today. But don't be fooled by small groups' quiet simplicity. When we come together in the name of Jesus, put our trust in him, and share our faith with each other, our courage grows. Sometimes it's only one person at a time, but the Holy Spirit is changing lives, and the Kingdom of God is growing in our midst. What we do and say in the presence of Christ and his people has a way of rippling out into the world in powerful ways we never imagined. It's always been this way with the Church.

Jesus describes faith (and the Church) as a tiny mustard seed that grows into a non-descript but hardy and invasive shrub (Matthew 13:31-32). The current factions of the world may try to overpower each other and out-shout each other, but in the middle of the noise and confusion, the invasive shrub is quietly growing and spreading. That's what we're doing with small groups; equipping each other to mount a quiet but unstoppable invasion of the world, for Jesus' sake.

I encourage all St. John's members to seriously think and pray about joining a Going Deeper small group sometime in the coming months. It's another way our wonderful congregation helps us to be pilots for Christ, and to fly for real.

Our speaker is Ed Reeves, a Grove City resident with a very interesting and heartfelt story to tell. "My Search for my Vietnam Scout Dog, Prince" is the title of a book he wrote in 2016 The following was copied from Amazon's website where his book is for sale.



"After training for five months at Fort Benning, *Prince* and *Ed Reeves* worked as a point team on patrols in the jungles of Vietnam. They ate together, slept together, sloshed through rice paddies together, walked up and down mountain trails in the heat and monsoon rain together, and flew in choppers together.

When Ed's tour was up and he got to go home, the hardest part was saying goodbye to *Prince*. He had to stay. Ed thought about him all the time, wondering what happened to him. When the troops were pulled out in 1973, Ed gave *Prince* up for dead. He just wondered how. How did he die? Was it fast in the heat of a battle, or was he euthanized because he was considered excess equipment? Or the worst fate--was he turned over to the South Vietnamese Army? For 36 years Ed had those questions. *In 2007, he found out what happened!*" **And on the 17**th **so can you!!**


