Letter from the Associate Pastor

"So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness"

~ Colossians 2:6-7

Dear Disciples of Jesus,

When I read Colossians 2:6-7 it hits home. The phrase, "overflowing with thankfulness," begins to repeat itself over and over in my mind.

"Overflowing" — "abounding," some translations say — brings the mental picture of the Thanksgiving cornucopia spilling out an abundant harvest blessing. Jesus said, "Out of the abundance of the heart, the mouth speaks." What is in my heart? Complaining? Selfishness? Pride? — or Thanksgiving?

Thanksgiving is the mark of a Christian because thanksgiving points out and up while my complaining points only back to me and feeds my pride and dissatisfaction. Thanksgiving towards God and man fits the Great Commandment like a glove, to love God with all my heart, soul, mind, and strength, and to love my neighbor as myself. What better vehicle than thankfulness to express love?

The Pillsbury Doughboy® has that endearing quality that when you poke him, he doesn't flare up but automatically responds with a friendly, perky, "Oh!" I want to be like him. Not so plump, mind you, but that full of friendliness. When someone pokes me, I want my first instinct to be thankfulness rather than anger. I want people to find thankfulness oozing out of me. I want thanksgiving to mark my conversation and manner. I want to abound with it, be full of it. I want to overflow with thankfulness.

I want the words that flow from my mouth to be hymns of praise for all the blessings I have received from God.

May this month of gratitude be a preparation for the day itself, when we gather with those we love and give thanks.

OWLS EVENT - NOVEMBER 19, 2021

The OWLS will not be asking for members to donate as we usually do to help defray our costs but will be asking for donations to help a needy family from St. John's at Thanksgiving. Thank you for caring!

Thanksgiving. What does that mean to you? A day off from work? Lots of food? Football? Parades? Or, do you make this holiday a day to think about your many blessings and thank God for another wonderful year? Some past years were very good. Some were not. But we always felt God's love and had faith that everything would be better.

BUT. Our society, unfortunately, has many men, women, and children with little to be thankful for – just another day. They don't have health care, a job, a home or shelter, a bed, and some don't even have food. But they do have organizations with people who care and try to help them.

Our program is about one of the programs available. Mount Carmel Street Medicine. For more than 30 years, Mount Carmel Street Medicine has been providing free urgent medical care to central Ohioans who are uninsured or underinsured. The Street Medicine team serves individuals experiencing homelessness, refugees, immigrants, victims of human trafficking, and anyone who has barriers accessing medical care. The Street Medicine mobile medical coach visits several regular central Ohio sites on a rotating basis and offers urgent medical care, common medications, limited vaccinations, employment screenings, case management, and referrals to primary care, spiritual care, as well as other community resources, such as housing, food, and addiction treatment resources. In addition, small care teams round regularly on people living on the streets to provide direct medical and social care, and follow people from homelessness to housed, ensuring the best transition possible.



St. John's very own Laura Imbrock will share more details and information about Street Medicine and her experiences.
