Letter from the Pastor

On January 6th, the Church celebrates Epiphany, where we remember the Magi who came to worship the child Jesus in Matthew 2:1-12.

We often call the Magi the wise men. Wisdom is knowledge that's been put to work, shaped and tested by the trials of life. The Magi were wise because they took the knowledge that was already spelled out for them (from Scripture) and they did not just sit on it. They acted on it; they used it as a map for a journey. They didn't just see the star shining on the horizon; they trusted the light that God was shining on that particular path. They set off into unknown lands following the knowledge and the light that God had given them.

This is what it is to worship our incarnate God. Not just to know OF him. But to live and walk by what he's done for us. To take the journey of the cross ourselves, trusting that at the end of it, we will always come to exactly what God has promised us through Jesus—new birth. Resurrection. Victory! We've all heard about this Lord, we know OF him. Now we can follow him, go out into the world where he wants us to go.

Our global purpose as the Church, and our local purpose here at St. John's, is to be guiding stars for the people around us. Not just good people, but good shepherds. People who guide others to Jesus. You notice, the Magi didn't just have a general map in front of them as they made their journey. They also had a star that went with them. So many people today need that living guidance in a desperate way. A lot of them have the information—the basic map. But they need someone to take their hand. They need a living, breathing human being, not to take the walk for them, but to walk with them from the manger of Jesus to the final victory of Jesus over death.

One of my loved ones used to talk about her faith in a passive way, like she was always waiting for God to do something for her—perform some miracle, shine some light on her life so she could find the path. Well, Epiphany changes that perspective: God has taken up his residence in your flesh. He has made your body his temple. And it is IN YOU, in what you do daily, that people out there are going to see the light of the world and come to worship him. I always told my loved one that a great way to start seeing the path God wants you to take in life is to start finding the most simple, concrete ways you can to help other people. Use whatever gifts you have to show other people God's love in Jesus Christ, in real practical ways. Don't sit after Christmas waiting for God to be born a second time to give you a new revelation. He has already made your body his temple. The hard thing is to take those first few steps to follow him. But the path will open in front of you when you take those steps.

With the Word, we're free to go anywhere in this world, without fear. Because we've already received our future. Arise, shine! Your destination has come to you. Your light has come.

ST. JOHN'S CEMETERY UPKEEP AND MAINTENANCE

SALE TOPE

It has been brought to our attention that a number of gravestones in the church cemetery were in need of major and minor repair work. Work has begun, and many of the stones have been dug up and reset, and several had the old bases removed completely with new bases poured. Some of the broken stones have been repaired. Several stones that were pushed out of place, turned around, or completely moved into other rows, have been moved back to their original grave sites and are again facing the appropriate direction. With much of the necessary major repairs completed, some of the very old stones have been cleaned, yet there are many more to go.

Once Spring comes in 2022, more repairs and cleaning will be done. Some of the large stones that need to have new bases poured and straightened up may need to be completed by a different company because of the size and weight of the monuments, requiring specialized equipment.

ACCESSIBILITY PLAN PRESENTATIONS IN JANUARY

For the past several months a team of St. John's members has been consulting with architects to explore ways our St. John's church building could:

- become more accessible and safe for disabled and elderly members
- * be more physically welcoming to visitors
- incorporate a warm fellowship space for all our members

The team is particularly excited about a proposal from the McKnight Group, a local architect firm, which we believe would meet our needs. Throughout the month, the team will be providing opportunities for all members of St. John's to see the McKnight proposal and ask questions.

At the end of January, during our Annual Congregational Meeting, we will make a motion that the congregation proceed to the next step, which would be to formulate a possible funding plan for the project.

Please be aware that a positive vote in January would only be the first step of several. The congregation would need to OK a clearly-defined funding plan at a later date in order for any project to actually begin.

We hope you will come and participate in one (or more) of the informational forums we are planning in January. Scheduled forum dates will follow in upcoming NewsNotes.

Please pray for God's guidance for St. John's as we consider the possibility of this big project. May all we do be to the praise and glory of our Lord Jesus Christ!
