Letter from the Associate Pastor

Dear Disciples of Jesus,

John 3:16 May be the most famous, most well known and most loved verse in the Bible. If a person knows just one verse, most likely it is this one. Often, it's the first verse children learn at an early age.

How do we know someone loves us? They say those three magic words: "I Love You", and our heart explodes with joy when we hear it whispered in our ear. But these words alone are not the only reason we know someone loves us.

I remember one time when our girls were small, Jeff asked them how they knew their mama loved them. Now, I tell them I love them every day, but when they were asked, they didn't say, "Because she says so." Without fail, they would answer with something I had done that was a demonstration of my love for them.

You and I can be confident that God loves us, not simply because we hear these words, but because we see the demonstration of his love. We see the sacrifice of something far more precious than anything we ourselves could give. The gift of love that God gave was his only Son. He offered something very dear to him, something he cared deeply about, that you and I might be saved.

Salvation is the gift we receive because of his gift of Jesus. Salvation is free, but certainly not cheap. It cost us nothing, but it cost the Son of God his very life. God willingly gave this gift as a demonstration of his love, and it was on display for the entire world.

This text from John 3:16 is not about how loving we are, but about how generous the love of God is. God loved us before we were saved. He acted in love, that we might be saved. He loved us first in order that we in turn might love.

My friends, during this time post-holiday, as we continue to celebrate the birth of our Savior, remember the gift, the sacrifice made in tremendous love, that you and I might have eternal life in Him.
