The Book of Psalms is the great prayerbook of the church, even as it has always been for the Jewish people. There is truly a psalm for every occasion in life.

Over the centuries, seven psalms in particular have been a source of insight and meaning to those in need of repentance, those harassed by sin, those who need to confess their sin and turn to God's loving mercy for rescue. The church assigns them during Lent as a way to encourage the repentant faithful to pray them. During Lent, we will reflect on these seven psalms as part of our Lenten Discipline.

On Wednesday, March 9, we will host the OTTERBEIN UNIVERSITY CHOIR, under the direction of Dr. Gayle Walker. They will present a 40-minute concert in the sanctuary as that evening's Lenten service. Plan now to make this a part of your Lenten journey.
