C: Amen.




APOSTOLIC GREETING

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Holy God, mighty and immortal, you are beyond our knowing, yet we see your glory in the face of Jesus Christ. Transform us into the likeness of your Son, who renewed our humanity so that we may share in his divinity, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

FIRST READING: Exodus 34:29-35

Moses came down from Mount Sinai. As he came down from the mountain with the two tablets of the covenant in his hand, Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God. When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, the skin of his face was shining, and they were afraid to come near him. But Moses called to them; and Aaron and all the leaders of the congregation returned to him, and Moses spoke with them. Afterward all the Israelites came near, and he gave them in commandment all that the Lord had spoken with him on Mount Sinai. When Moses had finished speaking with them, he put a veil

on his face; but whenever Moses went in before the LORD to speak with him, he would take the veil off, until he came out; and when he came out, and told the Israelites what he had been commanded, the Israelites would see the face of Moses, that the skin of his face was shining; and Moses would put the veil on his face again, until he went in to speak with him.

SECOND READING: 2 Corinthians 3:12-4:2

Since, then, we have such a hope, we act with great boldness, not like Moses, who put a veil over his face to keep the people of Israel from gazing at the end of the glory that was being set aside. But their minds were hardened. Indeed, to this very day, when they hear the reading of the old covenant, that same veil is still there, since only in Christ is it set aside. Indeed, to this very day whenever Moses is read, a veil lies over their minds; but when one turns to the Lord, the veil is removed. Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. And all of us, with unveiled faces, seeing the glory of the Lord as though reflected in a mirror, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another; for this comes from the Lord, the Spirit. Therefore, since it is by God's mercy that we are engaged in this ministry, we do not lose heart. We have renounced the shameful things that one hides; we refuse to practice cunning or to falsify God's word; but by the open statement of the truth we commend ourselves to the conscience of everyone in the sight of God.

HOLY GOSPEL: Luke 9:28-36 (37-43a)

Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah" not knowing what he said. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen. On the next day, when they had come down from the mountain, a great crowd met him. Just then a man from the crowd shouted, "Teacher, I beg you to look at my son; he is my only child. Suddenly a spirit seizes him, and all at once he shrieks. It convulses him until he foams at the mouth; it mauls him and will scarcely leave him. I begged your disciples to cast it out, but they could not." Jesus answered, "You faithless and perverse generation, how much longer must I be with you and bear with you? Bring your son here." While he was coming, the demon dashed him to the ground in convulsions. But Jesus rebuked the unclean spirit, healed the boy, and gave him back to his father. And all were astounded at the greatness of God.





Listening for the Promise

WEEKLY DEVOTIONAL

Transfiguration of Our Lord - February 27, 2022

"the appearance of his face was altered...." (Luke 9:29)

Today we remember the Transfiguration of Jesus on the mountain. These epiphanies, these special moments of revelation when the veil is pulled back and divine things become real to us, are not our making. Rather, they come as an unexpected and undeserved gift from God.

On the mountain, Jesus' face changed, and his clothes flashed like lightning. Moses and Elijah were talking with him. A cloud covered them and they were overcome with awe. A voice said, "This is my Son, my chosen one, listen to him!" Then the astonished disciples got up and followed Jesus back down to the valley and resumed their work. But they resumed their work with a different sense. They thought they knew Jesus, but they really didn't. They were astonished, confused, and maybe even repelled by some of his sermons. They had seen him perform miracles, yet, they knew little about his true identity and mission.

Through the transfiguration, the disciples discover Jesus is considerably more than a wise teacher or a great preacher. This man the disciples walked with was God's very Son, Immanuel, God present with us.

The Transfiguration is a revelation for the disciples. Not only is it revealed Jesus is God's Son, but also the peculiar way in which Jesus Christ is God with us. This Sunday is not only the end of the church season of Epiphany but the beginning of the season of Lent. Ash Wednesday is coming when we will gather, confess our sin, have ashes imposed upon our foreheads, and begin a forty-day walk with Jesus to the cross. But for one brief moment, the veil is pulled back, and we see. The Transfiguration is a moment for us to admit that our faith is utterly dependent upon God. This only comes to us as a gift. And the beautiful thing is, it does come!

Maybe you have not received as many mystical, revealing, epiphanic moments as you would like. Some of you are still waiting for that God-given moment when your fears will be taken away, your faith will be confirmed and strengthened, and you will see and believe. Today's scripture gives us a promise: keep walking with Jesus, whether he takes you up the mountain or down the valley. Keep listening and walking with him, no matter where he goes. God will be with you.
