Letter from the Associate Pastor

Dear Disciples of Jesus,

As you read this newsletter, it's not yet Easter, not yet time to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord. This got me to thinking about the in-between of Holy Week and Easter Sunday. Smack in the middle of all that is Holy Saturday.

For all the things written in the Scriptures about the trial, crucifixion and death of Jesus, there's very little, if anything said about what happened on Saturday. In John's Gospel, the last we hear is that Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus have secretly anointed Jesus' body in myrrh and aloes, wrapped him in a linen cloth and placed him in a new tomb. But because it was the Day of Preparation, and because it was almost sundown, they would have had to hurry home for the beginning of Passover.

Can you imagine them gathering in their homes for Passover? For all those who had known and loved Jesus, it would have been a most somber of celebratory meals. The tears would have flown freely as they remembered their beloved friend.

Anyone in our congregation who has tried to celebrate a holiday after the death of a loved one, or who has come to the birthday of a loved one who has died recently, knows how hard it is, and how empty that empty chair can be.

Holy Saturday provides us with an opportunity to remember our shared grief in a way that is rare. Sure, there are times when we lose someone who is well known in the community or church and it draws us all together as one body, but this day is an opportunity for all of us to grieve the death of our beloved Jesus.

John gives us the lead on how to do this – to keep silent, to utter not a word. To stop by church and sit in the stillness of the sanctuary and reflect on what it would mean to live in a world without God in it. To reflect on what you would say at a memorial service for Jesus if given the opportunity. To acknowledge the death of Jesus in a way that seems most appropriate for you.

Think about what you did on the day a loved one died. You go to the funeral home, you pick out the clothes, the casket or urn, make plans for the service, welcome friends, and family, but mostly, you weep. You just weep. Mourning is the most profound act we can experience at the death of a loved one. To mourn is to acknowledge a profound loss. To avoid mourning by staying busy or denying the pain is to invite it back in years to come. Holy Saturday is a day for tears, a day for mourning. Is there any remembrance of a loved one more eloquent than that?

## OWLS EVENT—DATE CHANGE—APRIL 22, 2022

The Older Wiser LutheranS (OWLS) are inviting you to their April 22<sup>nd</sup> meeting. We are excited to host a guest speaker from Franklin County Department on Aging. She will be sharing very important information about Senior Options. The department helps residents of Franklin County, age 60 and older maintain their independence. It also supports family members with the often overwhelming task of caring for a frail older parent, family member or friend with limited abilities.

What services? Here are care a few: Home-delivered meals, homemaker services, personal care, respite care, adult day care, emergency response systems and minor home repairs.

Over 7,000 older adults receive Senior Options services monthly, 73 percent of the participants are female, 68 percent are over 70 years of age and 65 percent live alone. Over 4,000 callers per month contact Senior Options for information and referral or access to services. Senior Options is funded by the Senior Services Levy which has been passed by Franklin County voters every five years since 1992.



Come and hear more about this amazing program. Guests are always welcome so if you know anyone who might benefit from these resources, invite them!!! We offer friendship, companionship and support for each other. And of course we love our potluck! OWLS will provide fried chicken but you will have to join us to see if meat loaf is on the menu!
