Letter from the Pastor

I was recently reading a magazine published by a declining mainline protestant denomination. Suddenly it struck me: hardly anyone in these articles is mentioning Jesus or his title, "Christ." I went back to the beginning and did a quick word search. The results: in a 46 page Christian magazine, Jesus was mentioned five times, mostly in a single article by a seminary student, who used the awkward formulation "God, Jesus, and the Spirit" three times.

On the same lines, I was reading the website of a protestant congregation recently where the pastor was inviting everyone to come to a class called "Deconstructing Jesus."

Why are a lot of people—including members of mainline Christian denominations—having trouble with Jesus? Why do many Christians seem to want to separate the name "Jesus" from the word "God?" The reason is simple. Jesus is a specific person who makes exclusive claims for himself, such as "I am the way, the truth, and the life." God's Church affirms that "salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12). You can't get too far into Jesus without having to deal with these exclusive claims. In short, Jesus simply will not fit with today's universalism. Universalism is uncomfortable saying that Jesus is more authoritative than Allah, Buddha, or any other religious figure.

Universalism has been around for thousands of years. Now it is the pre-eminent faith of the western world. It has even replaced Jesus at the center of many mainline Christian congregations.

Universalism believes that in a perfect world, all things would be equal in value. Which would be true, if death were god. Universalism also claims a veneer of "science based" authority, but not because it follows science (which is created by God). Rather, it strangely claims "science" as a justification to reduce all things to moral equivalence. This mental habit of balancing everything out to zero is easy to teach and learn, and can even become a kind of religious faith. College students are being taught to see (and make) all things equal from the moment they step onto campus. The unquestioned assumption is that "if everyone was sensible, we would all speak and think like universalists."

Of course, we know that in real life, nothing in God's creation is equal, except in mathematics. So when universalists try to fix the world, they end up forcing everything and everyone into a mold where differences of background, differences in speech, differences of opinion, differences in morals, differences in ability, differences in economic circumstances, even differences in sex, all get squashed. Universalists' motives might be noble at first (e.g. to eradicate unfairness), but the end results of their actions are almost always misery and evil. In the wake of the destruction they create, universalists often sound like the character from Animal Farm, who explained his tyrannical actions by saying "All animals are equal... but some are more equal than others."

Believers need to be able to see through the enemy's current strategy and call it out. God created us all marvelously with different strengths and weaknesses, and we are all born into different circumstances. Whatever our current situation, strong or weak, God means to be glorified in us (see John 9:1-3). Jesus didn't come to fit us all into the same mold. He came to save us from the sameness that Satan wants to impose upon us. He loves our differences. He does not force us together. He unites us in worship around himself. Thank God, we do not depend on our ability to be broad-minded. We instead freely gather around a risen Savior who has paid the full price for our narrow-mindedness and sin. A Savior who, while we are dead in the grave of our self-righteousness, calls each of us by name to come out! A Savior whose love will not be bound by our zero-sum notions of justice, but who rather loves each individual infinitely.

Praise be to God in Jesus Christ that we broken sinners at St. John's have been redeemed, so that we can freely come together with all our wonderful God-given differences, and be part of the multi-limbed, multi-gifted Body of Christ (1 Cor 12:12-31)! Praise Jesus, that our differences will never, ever be erased, but will in the end ring out in symphonic beauty through all eternity to the praise of our loving Savior God!

Never be discouraged. (Joshua 10:25)


