Letter from the Associate Pastor

Dear Disciples of Jesus,

"When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. (Acts 2:1-4)

Pentecost Sunday is June 5th this year (50 days after Easter) and marks the beginning of the Christian Church. The disciples had been trying to make sense of Jesus' resurrection appearances and his ascension. As Jesus is departing from them, he promises an advocate who would come to dwell among them. As the disciples were all together in one place, the Spirit descended upon them, and they began to speak in different languages, so that those gathered from around the known world could understand in their native tongue. It is in this moment that the disciples become apostles, those who are sent out. It is the Spirit, then, that empowers and sends disciples into the world.

This year, as we hear the story of Pentecost, we are reminded that we too are sent by the Spirit into the world to bear God's creative and redeeming Word to all.

The Spirit sends us into the world both as a community of faith and as individuals. We are sent as a community to serve others through our Bed Brigade, Good Samaritan help, and Vacation Bible School. We are sent as individuals when we sit at the bedside of those in the hospital or at home, offer a caring conversation with a co-worker, or sharing a bottle of water on a hot day to someone in need.

Our youth will be having another service retreat where they will do a variety of projects, both here at church as well as in the community. I love that we teach our youth what it means to be servants for those in need.

It can be both exciting and frightening to be sent into the world to serve those in need. And so, we trust that the Spirit goes ahead of us, is with us, and will abide after us. Thanks be to God for the work that we are called and empowered to do!





The Quilters try to help the less fortunate by showing God's love and our understanding of their situations. Our main focus is to make quilts for our Christmas sale and give the proceeds to various church ministries. We donate some of the unsold quilts to children's charities. During the last half of the year, we make 100 Christmas bags for children whose families use

the food pantries and request items to fill the bags. Our two on-going projects are collecting used greeting card fronts for The Cancer Thrift Store and preparing and mailing off used stamps for hand rehabilitation at two military hospitals. At the end of the year, we donate most of our treasury to food pantries and various church ministries.
