FIRST READING: Acts 11:1-18

Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, saying, "Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?" Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice saying to me, 'Get up, Peter; kill and eat.' But I replied, 'By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' 9 But a second time the voice answered from heaven, 'What God has made clean, you must not call profane.' This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.' And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?" When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, "Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life."

SECOND READING: Revelation 21:1-6





WEEKLY DEVOTIONAL

Fifth Sunday of Easter – May 15, 2022

"And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying,
"Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them,
and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God."

- Revelation 21:3 -

This awe-inspiring verse proclaims the fulfillment of God's greatest desire for humanity. Scripture tells us that, in the beginning, God created the magnificent universe in which we live. He created the heavens, the world, and all the beautiful flora and fauna within it. He created people, and then, "God saw everything that he had made, and behold, it was very good" (Gen. 1:31). God then walked among his creation in the garden with Adam and Eve (see Gen. 3:8). There, they enjoyed unbroken, loving relationship, just as God desired from the start. There, Adam and Eve enjoyed the manifest presence of God and the fullness of his beauty and love. We can only imagine the delight and bliss they must have experienced in the presence of their loving God.

Catastrophically for all creation, Adam and Eve chose to mistrust and, consequently, to disobey God. As a result, God forced them to leave the garden (see Gen. 3). God, in his wisdom, love, and goodness simply would not allow Adam and Eve to eat from the Tree of Life and live forever in their fallen, sinful state. (see Gen. 3:22-24).

No, from before the foundation of the world, God had much bigger and better plans for them and for all humanity (see Eph. 1:4-8). He had plans for freedom from the bondage of sin, death, and suffering. He had plans for salvation through Jesus Christ for all who chose to repent and follow him. He had plans for not only a new and gloriously perfect creation, but also for a new and gloriously perfect humanity in Christ. He had plans for once again walking arm-in-arm in sweet communion with all who believe and follow him.

How beautifully Scripture, from Genesis through Revelation, reveals the love story of God's ceaseless, ardent desire for unbroken, eternal relationship with us. One day God will completely fulfill this love story, and we who remain faithful to him will dwell with him and he with us, just as Revelation 21:3 promises. We will be his and he will be ours forever. What a beautiful culmination to the most exquisite love story ever told.
