Letter from the Pastor

What can I do when my older son or daughter doesn't have any interest in Jesus or his Church?

I've heard the question many times and am sometimes concerned by what I see in my own extended family. With older children, many things are beyond our control, and we need to face it, and just pray. And pray. And pray. But I know there will always be one awesome thing I'll be able to do as a Christian parent.

Recently I was reading through some of my old journals from college. In them, I noticed that when I referred to Christ, it was with a kind of desperation. When I felt alone and spiritually starved, I would go to Jesus and acknowledge him as my only hope in the death of self I was experiencing. What I had read in scripture and heard about Jesus from my parents and church friends and pastors—that Jesus was the only true Savior—became personal and real to me when I was in those spiritually vulnerable situations. I keep this in mind when I look at the world and the demons of universalism that young people are wrestling with today.

Desperately turning to Jesus as our Savior is very different than keeping him on the shelf as another helpful example of goodness when we need him. When we know Christ as our Savior, we know that nothing within ourselves is going to carry us through. Our wisdom, our intelligence, our personal philosophy of life, our open-mindedness, our political convictions—all of these are dirty rags [Isaiah 64:6]. They don't have any lasting power. If we know Jesus only as another wisdomgiver, another teacher, another example, another helper in life, then he won't have any staying power for us either. Only the One who was nailed to a cross, and who meets us there in our death and saves us from eternal darkness by the power of his resurrection... only he stands.

When people who love us tell us that Christ is their Savior, they are revealing something fragile in themselves. They are saying "I might be the wisest parent in the world, but in the end I am a beggar. I need to be saved." This is so hard to admit openly and honestly, especially in a world where the illusion that we can find a way (or an escape) around every challenge is so strong.

As a parent, sure I've done OK at equipping my children with the lessons and tools I think they need to live a good life. Where I've been tempted to take the easy road, however, is when I've had those opportunities to open up and honestly tell my children the truth: that ultimately I'm a beggar with nothing to offer them except Jesus.

I'm not saying that God wants us to be children with our children. We will always be guides to them. But nothing makes a bigger impression on our older children than those moments when we bare our souls to them, and let them know that we, also, have been desperate for a good parent throughout our lives. I remember very well those moments when my parents showed their vulnerability to me, making it clear that Jesus was not just another way to happiness, but that he was their only hope for the future.

As our children become older, we lose control over all the little things. This is how God intends it to be. But there's one thing I know I will always be able to do for my children, as the Holy Spirit gives me the courage to do it. It's to tell them the big thing openly and honestly: Jesus is my only hope. He is the only hope I've ever had. The Holy Spirit will work with that.

On May 30, 1925, Mabel Wagnalls Jones dedicated The Wagnalls Memorial in honor of her parents, Adam and Anna Willis Wagnalls. Adam was the co-founder of the publishing giant, Funk & Wagnalls. Both Adam and Anna were born in log cabins in Lithopolis Ohio. Mabel knew it had always been her mother's dream to do something for the little village which had never had anything done for it and to provide opportunities not available to her as a child. With the building of The Wagnalls Memorial, Mabel would fulfill her mother's dream.

Mabel, an author and a concert pianist, had a special fondness for her parents' birthplace. Although she lived most of her life in New York City, she visited it from the time she was a small child to spend time with her grandmother who lived in the village.

Come join us and see paintings that were used as covers for Funk & Wagnalls' magazine The Literary Digest adorn the walls of the Rager Reading Room. Two original Norman Rockwell paintings are on permanent display near the patron services desk.

Take a stroll on the pathways in the garden to admire the rock sculptures and martin house of Dr. Edward Roller. He collected rocks from all over North America and used them to create bird houses, vases, and other structures. It is a hidden treasure for our area.






FAITH IN ACTION FOR GRADES 5 - 8 (going into this fall)
