Letter from the Pastor

For Christians who follow the traditional church calendar, the month of November brings *THE END* into view.

We start the month off with the Festival of All Saints, when we give thanks for all the believers, over the centuries, who have died in Christ. For many of us, it's also a day to honor the memory of faithful family members and friends we've lost. It's no coincidence that our country observes Memorial Day in early November. These special days naturally make us think about *the end*.

Then, as we move through the month, our Bible readings in church begin to point towards the Day of Judgment and the end of the world.

The church calendar itself ends on Christ the King Sunday (November 20th this year). That day, in worship, we will hear the passage in Luke where Jesus is hanging on the cross, pronouncing forgiveness for the people who are killing him, and then telling the dying criminal next to him: "today you will be with me in paradise."

As I go through these busy weeks, making plans for the season, I find it comforting to be reminded of *THE END*.

Many of us are feeling the squeeze at the gas pump and in the grocery store. Some of us are worrying about the bottom dropping out of our retirement plans. We see our country flirting with demonic ideologies. We see violent crime and theft happening in broad daylight in our bigger cities. We see the possibility of war boiling up in many parts of the world. Not knowing where all this is heading can certainly whip up a lot of fear and anxiety in our hearts.

But then we come to worship, and we hear about the end. We hear about where all this is heading. Our end has already come to us. He says to convicted criminals: "*Today* you will be with me in paradise." For sinners who look to Jesus as their only hope, the end is not death and loss. No—Jesus is our end, and he brings God's future to convicted sinners here and now.

So that means that while so much of the world is foundering in fear and anxiety, trying to escape its own end (because all it can see there is death and loss), you and I, fellow convicted sinners, are welcoming the end every day. The end has drawn close to us; he lives with us, and he gives us our future as a free gift. We pray, "Thy Kingdom Come," because we know that in Christ, no matter what is happening in this world or in our lives, *the end has already been given to us*. Even in death. So we live with gratitude; we live generously, we live with compassion towards each other and towards the person at the gate. [Luke 16:19-31]

What a beautiful gift we have at St. John's, that we can come together in a world that is ending, and sing our unending, joyful praises to to the Lamb who was slain, who has begun his reign.


