ACCESSIBILITY PROJECT - COMMITMENT SUNDAY: OCTOBER 16.



We are excited to be nearing our first major funding milestone for the Accessibility Project! With advance gifts, we have about \$630,000 in hand. Once we have \$700,000, we will secure a construction loan and begin building. Thank you so much to all of you who have given advance gifts. Your generosity has been amazing!

We are now asking all our members to pray about making long-term commitments to fund the project through to completion. Commitment cards are available in the church pews and church office.

October 16 will be Commitment Sunday, when we will celebrate the financial commitments that we've received so far. Please come to a special lunch that day in the Family Life Center, after the late worship services. We will also be giving thanks to God in worship that day for the generosity our congregation has shown in response to this special project.

Commitment cards can be returned to the church office or placed in the offering during worship. Working together, we can easily carry the burden of this project, as we make our beautiful church building more accessible to all who come to worship Christ at St. John's!

FIRST COMMUNION CLASS: SUNDAY, OCTOBER 30TH: Pastor Seth will be leading a class on Holy Communion for children on Sunday, October 30th at church from 12:15—1:45pm. The class will be geared towards 5th grade students; however, younger children who have expressed a serious desire to receive the sacrament are welcome to participate (as are older youths who have not yet received this instruction). We ask that at least one adult be present at the class with each child. We'll meet in the confirmation classroom on the third floor of the education wing. At the end of the class, parents and students will discuss whether the student is ready to receive the sacrament. Those who are ready will participate in their first communion at the 11am worship service on Sunday, November 6th.
