Letter from the Associate Pastor

The Nature of True Discipleship



4 This, then, is how you ought to regard us: as servants of Christ and as those entrusted with the mysteries God has revealed. ² Now it is required that those who have been given a trust must prove faithful. ³ I care very little if I am judged by you or by any human court; indeed, I do not even judge myself. ⁴ My conscience is clear, but that does not make me innocent. It is the Lord who judges me. ⁵ Therefore judge nothing before the appointed time; wait until the Lord comes. He will bring to light what is hidden in darkness and will expose the motives of the heart. At that time each will receive their praise from God. (1 Cor. 4:1-5)

Question: How many Christians does it take to change a light bulb? Answer: 10. One to change the bulb, and 9 to say, "We liked the old one better." Christians tend to have an opinion about everything and everyone in God's Church. The judgments often start over Sunday lunch or in the car on the way home from worship. And this is one way the devil distracts us, in order to steal the seed of God's Word immediately after it's been planted.

If you've ever... 1) given a thumbs down to the worship music because it was too loud or too bland, too fast or too slow, too traditional or not traditional enough; 2) ranked the choir, worship team, preacher, and kid's sermon (not necessarily in that order) on a scale of 1-10, according to your personal preferences; 3) If you've ever scored the sermon by comparing it to the podcast you heard earlier in the week from a preacher with an internationally acclaimed ministry, then you know what I mean.

Yeah, me too. A critical spirit exposes our fallen, hypocritical nature. It's just that Christ has given us a new nature, and Paul warns in these verses against the dangers of pronouncing such verdicts. It turns out that only Jesus gets to judge those who are called by his name. He has given some of us to be apostles and teachers, and if our words are not found to be biblical, confessional, and trustworthy, then by means call us to repent and refuse to listen until we do! This sort of judgment is good and necessary.

But we are all servants of the Lord (v. 1) and therefore fellow servants and encouragers of one another. There is only one Master who can ultimately judge our motives and effectiveness. Paul's detractors in Corinth evaluated him by superficial standards that had nothing to do with the gospel. His critics judged Paul's apostleship insufficient because he wasn't as polished and eloquent as the "super-preachers" that their wealthy, well-educated, congregation was used to.

But so what? Does it really matter what a clay pot looks like as long as it faithfully delivers Living Water? In that regard, we are all called to be jars of clay (see 2 Corinthians 4:7). We are flawed but useful vessels sent to pour out God's truth, hope, grace, and more to a world in need. So let's not be overly critical of the container, but rather rejoice in its uniqueness and celebrate the blessings it holds!

Note that the 4pm worship service will be held as usual Saturday, August 27th, but please join us on Sunday for the picnic and other activities!



ACCESSIBILITY PROJECT Q AND A

Q Why are we building a new Accessibility Wing onto the church?

A To provide a handicapped-accessible restroom for our members from the church sanctuary which is close at hand and which does not involve a long trip up and down multiple levels, as is currently the case. The new wing will include a lift which will make access to the sanctuary from the North Entrance much easier for members with mobility issues. Also, the new wing will make traveling from one end of the building to the other (from the sanctuary to the Family Life Center) possible without using any stairs, and without going outside. Finally, the addition will provide a more welcoming space for guests and visitors, and create a space for us to mingle before/after church and events.

Q Who is planning and building the new Accessibility Wing?

A The McKnight Group, based in Grove City, has not only given us the most economical bid for the work, but also has a wealth of experience and a proven track record building church additions in the Columbus area. At our January 2022 congregation meeting, St. John's approved McKnight's design for our building.

Q How much will the new addition cost?

A The budgeted cost, as presented to and approved by the congregation, will be 1.3 million dollars. A final price guarantee will be developed during the detailed design phase.

Q How is St. John's going to pay for the new addition?

A As of early July, we have already received nearly \$400,000 in advance gifts from members of the congregation. When we have \$700,000 in hand, we will apply for a construction loan and McKnight will begin the building process. We will not use any more than \$800,000 in loan money. The congregation will rely on continuing special donations, fundraisers, and regular pledged giving from congregation members to carry us through till the loan is completely paid off. We will also be applying to multiple institutions to receive grant money.

Q Can I see renderings of the building plan right now?

A Yes, nice renderings of the design are available to look at right now in Pastor Seth's office if you were not able to attend any of the congregational meetings. We'll have renderings on prominent display in church throughout the building process.

Q Where are we right now (July 2022) in the process?

A Currently we are in the "detailed design" phase. McKnight is now in process of preparing the comprehensive building plan which will include all the nuts and bolts, ducting, wiring, and so forth. This phase will last at least 4-6 months. In the meantime, we continue to raise funds to meet our initial \$700,000 milestone.

Q How can I give special monetary gifts to support the Accessibility Project?

A You can give special gifts at any time. Just send a check to the church office with a note specifying that you would like your gift to go to the Accessibility Project.



ACCESSIBILITY PROJECT Q AND A, cont'd

Q Will there be a pledge drive in support of the Accessibility Project?

A Yes. In late August and early September, all church households will receive a letter in the mail along with a pledge card that you can fill out. There will be multiple options on the pledge card describing how you can give on a regular basis towards the project. We will have temple talks in church for 3-4 weeks in the Fall leading to a special *Commitment Sunday* sometime in September.

Q Will there be smaller fundraisers throughout the year for the Accessibility Project, which I can support and/or volunteer to help with?

A Yes, our funding team is planning to have special fundraisers throughout the year, such as movie nights, dances and special sales. These fun events and will provide opportunities for our members to support the project through giving their time and talent.

Q When will the actual, physical process of building begin?

A It's hard to predict exactly, but taking into account the 4-6 months it will take to finish the detailed design work, and also how long it may take to raise the \$700,000 we have set as an initial milestone for ourselves, it's possible we'll be able to start building late in 2022 or early in 2023.

Q How long will the actual building process take place?

A McKnight has told us to prepare for a year-long building process, once the initial digging starts. That means that the new addition *could be* complete by the end of 2023 or early 2024.

Q Will we be able to use the North Entrance to the Sanctuary of the church during construction?

A At various points in the construction process, pedestrian traffic will need to be re-routed around the North Entrance to the sanctuary (and also around the north of the Link entrance at times). We will be communicating with our church members as far in advance as possible about these forecasted disruptions to our normal foot-traffic patterns.

Q What kind of communication will there be between St. John's leadership and McKnight during the detailed design process, and how will St. John's oversee the project?

A The construction team will meet as necessary with McKnight to review and approve various detailed designs. This will involve several sessions.

Q What kind of communication will there be between St. John's leadership and McKnight during the building process, and how will St. John's oversee the project?

A McKnight will hold weekly onsite communication sessions with our church construction team.

Q What happens if we have not raised the \$700,000 by the time detail design is completed?

A We have committed to the congregation that construction will not begin prior to having \$700,000 received or identified. A guaranteed price will be generated during the detail design phase. That price, due to inflation, will be good for a rather short period of time. Consequently, it will be important that we have the \$700,000 when detail design is completed, or the cost will likely continue to escalate.
