Traditional German Worship Service

St. James Lutheran Church, 5660 Trabue Road, Columbus, Ohio will host its annual German Worship Service, Sunday, Aug. 7 beginning at 2:30 p.m. The service will be conducted by Steven Maurer. A performance by the Columbus Maennerchor will precede the service at 1 p.m. under the entertainment tent at the annual Brats & Crafts Festival.

The service will last about one hour and will follow a traditional Lutheran service except that it will be spoken and sung entirely in the German language, featuring traditional hymns and a sermon reflecting the church's deep German heritage. The St. James Lutheran congregation was formed in 1847 by nine German settler families and was originally named St. Jakobus Gemeinde.
