**FIRST COMMUNION CLASS: SUNDAY, OCTOBER 30<sup>TH</sup>:** Pastor Seth will be leading a class on Holy Communion for children on Sunday, October 30<sup>th</sup> at church from 12:15—1:45pm. The class will be geared towards 5<sup>th</sup> grade students; however, younger children who have expressed a serious desire to receive the sacrament are welcome to participate (as are older youths who have not yet received this instruction). We ask that at least one adult be present at the class with each child. We'll meet in the confirmation classroom on the third floor of the education wing. At the end of the class, parents and students will discuss whether the student is ready to receive the sacrament.
