<u>OWLS EVENT</u> – JULY 21, 2023: The Older Wiser Lutheran Seniors (OWLS) have a very interesting program for our July meeting, and we hope you join us to hear about a wonderful program that benefits children less fortunate than some. Sufficient Grace is a non-profit organization made up of a loving group of people committed to providing love, hope and food to children in need. Their mission statement is "To provide children physical nourishment through food, and Spiritual encouragement through kindness and example." Since their launch in 2012, they have provided more than 827,880 meals, and with the donations, that number will grow every week.

Each school year 5500 volunteer hours and support are needed to make sure the program runs smoothly. This ensures that food is stocked, packaged and delivered each week for distribution at the end of the school day in time for a snack and later, dinner. No child is turned away. They also provide extra bags for students to take home to a younger sibling who is not of school age yet.

Their goal is to remove the barriers food insecurity can bring so they are better able to focus on school and have every opportunity to succeed which in turn helps our communities. Hope you join us and hear more about this extraordinary project.

The OWLS will provide fried chicken for our potluck lunch, but we ask you bring a covered dish and join your friends for a delicious lunch and a wonderful program.
