

Hello St. John's family,

My name is Lukas Althoff, and I am 11 years old. This year was my first mission trip and first time joining the Mexico Mission Family. I have always wanted to go on the Mexico mission trip since my mom started going when I was 4 years old. When I first learned I was getting the opportunity to go this year, I was super excited, but as it got closer I became really nervous. I knew God had a plan, and I wanted to share with you about my week at Rancho Genesis with my 5-year-old niño, Enrique.

On the first day Enrique was uncomfortable around me and only wanted to be around the other kids from the orphanage. The second day we did water games, and by that evening Enrique started to say a few words to me at the campfire. On the third day we got to swim in the pool and he asked me to take and hold him in the big kids pool, which was a huge improvement in his trust with me in just two short days. Later we went to a concert and fair. During the fair Enrique would ask for my help to get him food, play games with him, and so much more.



On the fourth day we played some games in a mud pit. Enrique pushed me towards the mud pit and threw mud at me all while giggling with such a big smile. Later we went to the beach where he asked me to make him a kite and gave me a big hug when I handed it to him. The weather was perfect! It was extremely windy that day, and we were able to fly the kite easily for at least an hour. Then we went into the water and caught a few waves while riding the boogie boards. On our last full day together we started with arts and crafts. I made a bracelet for Enrique and he surprised me with one as well. At our evening affirmation campfire, a translator helped us share stuff about our week with one another, and Enrique expressed how much fun he had all week with me, especially playing darts at the fair. I told him he was the number one niño in my heart.

The following morning we had a short time together eating breakfast and then saying our "God-byes" before leaving camp. After traveling for a couple hours we unexpectedly ran into the niños at a rest stop. I immediately jumped up, got out of the van, and gave Enrique another huge hug. I was so excited to see him again, but knew it was going to be hard to part ways because I was already missing him.

This week in Mexico with my niño and Mexico mission family was beyond anything I could have imagined. It helped me to be more patient with others and strengthened my faith and relationship with God so much. Thank you everyone for all your prayers, donations, and support to help make this trip possible. I pray that God will call me back to Mexico soon, and that one day I'll get to see Enrique again.

To my dear St. John's family, my brothers and sisters in Christ,

Greetings from Rancho Genesis in Baja California, Mexico. I was honored to be called by God to return for my fourth time after being away for five years. I was so excited to be able to connect with the niños again and to see all that had changed at the new camp that they hadn't even broken ground on yet during my last trip in 2018. This year God also laid it on our hearts to have our own son, Lukas, join the Mexico mission family, too. I was a bit nervous about how that would impact the mission, but was trusting that God had a plan and everything would work out in His glory.



What an incredible week we had with our 21 kids from an orphanage in Tijuana, Mexico. God paired me up with Kimberly, a sweet 9-year-old girl who was there with her 10 year old brother, while Lukas was paired up with an adventurous 5-year-old boy, Enrique. Kimberly and I made an instant connection which took me by surprise. In past years my niños have always been a little more hesitant to trust a stranger from another land who doesn't speak very much of their native language. I wouldn't expect anything different after all that these kids have been through in their short lives. However, this time was amazingly different.

Kimberly always wanted to be near me, play, walk together, and hold hands. She even opened up to me verbally although much of the time I had to ask someone to help me translate. We enjoyed games of UNO, making bracelets, singing around the campfire, swimming in the pool and ocean, and playing all of these amazing VBS/camp games while learning about God.

The only time Kimberly seemed a bit reserved was on our final day together when we got to a game they called "human foosball." Imagine a rectangle about 15 feet wide by 25 feet long surrounded by 4-foot-tall sheets of plywood. There were PVC pipes that slid side-to-side on metal poles. We had to hold on to the PVC pipes at all times while sliding side-to-side and trying to kick a soccer ball into the opponent's goal. You had to do all of that while being sprayed with water, eventually turning the dirt bottom into a muddy mess. Kimberly watched from the side during our first match as she expressed no interest and didn't seem to want to join in. Part way through the match, out of nowhere, she came running in and traded out with someone else so she could be right next to me. We worked together with the rest of our team, laughing, getting wet, and getting extremely muddy, but we had so much fun. We did end up winning which wasn't so bad either. Nonetheless, it was just great to see her jump into something she wasn't so sure about and have fun.

We had such an amazing week together and truly connected. It never ceases to amaze me how God's love transcends everything, and it doesn't need a language to understand. I was honored to be able to be God's hands and feet, to witness not only the spiritual growth in my niña, Kimberly, but to see how this wonderful experience affected my own son, Lukas, and his own relationship with God, too. It is my hope that the love they felt from perfect strangers reinforces the never-ending love our Father in heaven has for all of us, and a reminder that we aren't in this alone. We can often rely on others to help us, but no matter what, God will always be there for us, to help and guide us, through the good times and the bad. He is our way, our truth, and our life. Thank you for all of your love, prayers and support for our niños and our Mexico mission family. Lukas, myself, and the rest of the family are eternally grateful and honored to have been a part of this incredible mission!

TIPS FOR HANDLING THE HOLIDAYS WHEN GRIEVING

- 1. DECIDE WHAT YOU CAN HANDLE COMFORTABLY AND LET FAMILY AND FRIENDS KNOW. Can I handle the responsibility of the family dinner, etc. or shall I ask someone else to do it? Do I want to talk about my loved one or not? Shall I stay here for the holidays or go to a completely different environment?
- 2. MAKE SOME CHANGES IF THEY FEEL COMFORTABLE FOR YOU. Open presents Christmas Eve instead of Christmas morning. Vary the timing of gift giving. Have dinner at a different time or place. Let the children take over decorating the house, the tree, baking, and food preparation, etc.
- 3. RE-EXAMINE YOUR PRIORITIES: GREETING CARDS, HOLIDAY BAKING, DECORATING, PUTTING UP A TREE, FAMILY DINNER, ETC. Do I really enjoy doing this? Is this a task that can be shared?
- 4. CONSIDER DOING SOMETHING SPECIAL FOR SOMEONE ELSE. Donate a gift in the memory of your loved one. Donate money you would have spent on your loved one as a gift to charity. Adopt a needy family for the holidays. Invite a guest (foreign student, senior citizen) to share festivities.
- 5. RECOGNIZE YOUR LOVED ONE'S PRESENCE IN THE FAMILY. Burn a special candle to quietly include your loved one. Hang a stocking for your loved one in which people can put notes with their thoughts or feelings. Listen to music especially like by the deceased. Look at photographs.
- 6. IF YOU DECIDE TO DO HOLIDAY SHOPPING, MAKE A LIST AHEAD OF TIME AND KEEP IT HANDY FOR A GOOD DAY, OR SHOP ONLINE OR THROUGH CATALOGS.
- 7. OBSERVE THE HOLIDAYS IN WAYS WHICH ARE COMFORTABLE FOR YOU. There is no right or wrong way of handling holidays. Once you've decided how to observe the time, let others know.
- 8. TRY TO GET ENOUGH REST HOLIDAYS CAN BE EMOTIONALLY AND PHYSICALLY DRAINING.
- 9. ALLOW YOURSELF TO EXPRESS YOUR FEELINGS. Holidays often magnify feelings of loss. It is natural to feel sadness. Share concerns, apprehensions, feelings with a friend. The need for support is often greater during holidays.
- 10. KEEP IN MIND THAT THE EXPERIENCE OF MANY BEREAVED PERSONS IS THAT THEY DO COME TO ENJOY HOLIDAYS AGAIN. THERE WILL BE OTHER HOLIDAY SEASONS TO CELEBRATE.
- 11. DON'T BE AFRAID TO HAVE FUN. Laughter and joy are not disrespectful. Give yourself and your family members' permission to celebrate and take pleasure in the holidays.

Letter from the Associate Pastor



"Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever.

Give thanks to the God of gods, for his steadfast love endures forever.

Give thanks to the Lord of lords, for his steadfast love endures forever."

Psalm 136:1-3

Dear Disciples of Jesus,

Psalm 136 is one of the great psalms of thanksgiving. The rhythm of praise at the beginning breaks into a full-blown chorus of thanksgiving, celebrating who God is and what he has done for his people. By the end of the psalm, all the people would have joined in the chorus singing and shouting for joy. It's one of my favorites for praising God.

The point is, and is so clearly obvious in this psalm, that the natural state of creation is one of praise and thanksgiving to our Creator. When we give praise, we are only taking up our part of the song. Praise and thanksgiving may actually be our natural language, something we get separated from through the suffering and insecurity we experience in the world. If the hills are alive with the sound of music, shouldn't we be as well?

And yet, there is so much happening in this broken world of ours, war and chaos, famine and floods, fire and earthquakes, hell and heartache. So the psalmist reminds us, even in the midst of the mess, even when we cannot see our way through, the one thing that is for certain – "THE STEADFAST LOVE OF THE LORD ENDURES FOREVER".

As we remember those who have gone before us whether it be yesterday or years ago, as we celebrate All Saints, and again as we gather to celebrate Thanksgiving, perhaps a psalm of thanksgiving would be appropriate as our table prayer, repeating the refrain over and over - "THE STEADFAST LOVE OF THE LORD ENDURES FOREVER".

May each day, not just a holiday, be reason for us to offer praise and thanks to God, as we live out our lives in grateful praise for all He has given us.
