Outwardly, Kimberly was one of the more reserved and serious children, but it quickly became clear that she was doing her best to be a strong and responsible leader for the other niños. Throughout the week there were moments in which I worried we weren't spending enough time together, but I soon realized that this wasn't out of any disregard she had for me, it was simply due to her commitment to her "family." I had the chance to sit back and watch this amazing young lady in action, and yet be present when she needed a friend. One of my favorite moments of being Kimberly's amiga was sitting on the beach together quietly that Thursday after the staff called us out of the water. She grabbed a bucket and two shovels and we dug and dug into the sand until we couldn't go any further. We'd make progress but then the water would rush in and then we'd have to start all over again. This whole day reminded me of my favorite Bible passage: Matthew 7:24-25 which says, "Everyone who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock. The rain fell and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock."

Despite all the waves of life Kimberly has encountered, it is evident that, by God's grace, she is founded on the rock. Her love of Jesus shined through in the little things like a cross necklace that she created, her offers to pray for meals, and her servant's heart. I'm excited for all the ways God will continue to solidify Kimberly's foundation in Him, even if I never get to see that fruit in this life. Letter from the Pastor

In 2024, St. John's will celebrate the 175th anniversary of its founding in Grove City. We are organizing a series of events and activities which will make this milestone year one of deep gratitude and praise to God. He has truly made St. John's a shining light for Christ in this community. As we remember the past with thanksgiving, we will also be looking with confidence to what God will do with us and through us in the future.

- The following is a smattering of some of the fun and inspirational things we'll be doing in 2024 to observe our 175th anniversary:
- > Early in the year, we'll be celebrating the completion of a beautiful new addition to our church building, which will tie all three of our buildings together and make our sanctuary accessible to people with mobility issues.
- > We'll be inviting former pastors of St. John's to come and preach at various points in the year.
- > On May 12th (Mother's Day), we'll be having a special worship service with triumphant music and singing to commemorate the day our current sanctuary was dedicated (May 12, 1888).
- > A pictorial history of our congregation, drawn from our extensive archives, will be on display in the new wing.
- > One of our resident artists is planning to create renderings of the St. John's church campus at various stages of its development through the years.
- > We plan to host some musical events and concerts which will be open to the whole community.
- > In the summer, we'll be re-dedicating the St. John's cemetery, and honoring the Saints of our congregation who have passed into eternal life.
- > In September, we will be encouraging BIG participation in the Arts in the Alley parade. We hope you will join the march, proudly wearing your St. John's regalia!
- We will be making video recordings of members of our congregation, young and old, talking about their experience at St. John's, and showing these videos online and at various events through the year.
- > Several members of our congregation will be asked to give brief testimonials during worship services about how St. John's has nurtured them in their walk with Christ.
