

They are both over the age of 13. I was worried initially that we wouldn't connect easily. My worries were unfounded though because our God is so great!

It was difficult the first couple of days because they were so independent. I chose to trust God though, because I knew we were paired for a reason. I wanted them to know that I was there for them if they needed me. So, my goal was to simply be present.

As the week went on, I could see God's hand at work. Each day, they opened up to me little by little. Rebeca and I finally clicked the night of the fair. We ran around under the lights, played games, ate nachos and had raspadas (those were her favorite). It was a beautiful night, and you could see so many stars.

The next day, we all went to the beach. Here, the Lord provided a way for me to deepen my connection with Zaori. I could tell she was nervous about going into the ocean. So, we went together. We ran into the waves as fast as we could. When the waves started getting larger, she latched onto my arm. I would count down to each wave and then we would jump. I think it was her first time in the ocean and it was the most I had seen her smile and laugh.

My niñas were very much considered mother type figures since they were among the oldest of the group. It was amazing to see how they took care of their friends, especially the little ones. To me, it seemed like God wanted them to feel like kids again and to be the ones being served.

I can only hope and pray that this week brought them, if even a little bit, closer to Jesus. I pray that they feel and know they are loved, and that they know their worth. They both made such an impact on me and helped me to grow in my faith. I hope they saw Jesus in me because I saw Him shining through them.

About Shrove Tuesday



Shrove Tuesday is the day before Ash Wednesday and is a day to cleanse the soul and celebrate before the contemplative season of Lent begins. Shrove Tuesday derives its name from the ritual of "shriving" that Christians used to do in the past. In shriving, Christians confessed their sins, received forgiveness, and were released from the guilt and pain these sins had caused them.

SHROVE TUESDAY

The addition of pancakes to this celebration has an interesting history. In olden times, Christians would not eat certain foods during Lent such as meat, fish, fats, eggs, and milk products. So as to not waste any

food, families would feast on the shriving Tuesday, eating all the foods that would not last the forty days of Lent. Pancakes then became associated with Shrove Tuesday as their preparation would use up all the eggs, milk, and fats in the house.

Pancake races were added to the festivities when, in 1445, a woman lost track of time preparing her pancake dinner, heard the church bells calling her to worship, and ran from her house still carrying her frying pan! The most famous pancake race today is in England where the participants must toss their pancake at the start and finish of the 415-yard race and wear a scarf and apron.

Early Church History of St. John's

St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church is the oldest religious organization in Grove City. The history begins with St. John's in 1849. It was for those first pioneers of two Lutheran groups, one German and the other English. The German group was made up of people who had been in the country for a short period of time and spoke no English. The other group was made up of Pennsylvania Germans who could speak English and came to Ohio to find cheaper land. The first service was held in a log cabin called the Highland Mission. Mr. Breck and the Rev. R. K. Davis conducted the first service. Beginning in the new year of 1851, the members of the church were called to a meeting for the business of calling Professor William Lehmann for his assistance. Lehmann only served the German congregation and Rev. Greenwalt was called to hold the English services every other Sunday in the afternoon. In 1853, there was a new church built by George Weygandt. The tradition states that there was no sacristy, no organ, no choir loft, and no choir. In 1856, the English section withdrew from the church with others from the community coming to form the Presbyterian Church. During the same year, another group of people of the Missouri Synod Lutherans united to form a church called St. Paul's Lutheran Church only for five years until they merged with St. John's. Also in 1856, Lehmann resigned from being reverend. Rev. I. A. Schulze was called to serve both the German and English parts of the congregation. But he resigned in 1858. So, needing a new reverend, St. John's called Professor Emmanuel Schimid who served both St. John's and another congregation in addition to teaching at Capital University. In 1863, St. John's called their first resident pastor, Rev. Charles G. Reichert. There was talk because some of the congregation felt they could not be sure if they could guarantee an annual salary of \$300. He spoke several different languages, he was a good musician, and gifted in poetry, for which he wrote many great poems. During his tenure he instituted the children's celebration of Christmas and taught German in the parish. In 1871, the church bought its first organ at the price of \$550. In the great summer of 1885, Rev. Reichert was prompted to resign because of his old age.

Letter from the Associate Pastor

"By His Wounds We Are Healed" — Isaiah 53:5

Dear Friends.

The story is told of a small, orphaned boy who lived with his grandmother. One night the house caught fire as they slept. The grandmother was overcome with smoke. A crowd gathered around the burning house, and the boy's screams for help could be heard above the crackling of the blaze. Yet no one seemed to know what to do until help arrived.

Suddenly a stranger rushed through the crowd and began climbing an iron pipe that extended to the home's second floor. Hand over hand, he climbed the hot pipe, until he reached the upstairs window and disappeared. He reappeared seconds later to the cheers of the crowd, with the boy in his arms, then climbed back down the hot pipe as the child hung around his neck.

Weeks later a public hearing was held to determine in whose custody the orphaned boy would be placed. Each person wanting the boy was permitted to speak briefly. The first man said, "I have a huge farm. Every boy needs the outdoors." The second one said, "I'm a teacher. I have a large library, so he would receive a great education." Others came forward, too, until finally the richest man in town spoke. "I'm wealthy. I could give the boy everything mentioned so far: farm, education, and plenty besides, including money and travel. I would like him to come live with my wife and me.

The judge asked, "Would anyone else like to say a word?" From the rear of the room rose a stranger who had slipped unnoticed into the hall. As he walked toward the front with his hands in his pockets, deep suffering showed on his face. Reaching the front, he stood directly in front of the boy whose custody was being decided. Slowly, the stranger removed his hands from his pockets, and a gasp was heard throughout the room.

The man's hands were terribly scarred. Suddenly, the boy emitted a cry of recognition. Here was the very man who had saved his life. The farmer left, the teacher too. Then the rich man. Everyone departed, leaving the boy alone with his rescuer, who had won him without a word. The scarred hands spoke more effectively than words of his love for the boy.

The scarred, nail-pierced hands of Jesus speak effectively, too. They speak of forgiveness, life, love and salvation. And ultimately, of our adoption as God's own daughters and sons.

The season of Lent is upon us - 40 days in which to prepare for the celebration of God's great saving event at Easter... the Resurrection. Lent begins this year, ironically enough on Valentine's Day. When we love someone, one of the ways we show it is to spend time with them, to converse with them and get to know them in a more personal way. Our theme, which is explained in detail inside this newsletter is on prayer - specifically, praying with Jesus on the way to the Cross.

I invite you in this journey of Lent to deepen your relationship with the Lord through Mid-week Lenten services, Adult Sunday School Classes, daily prayer and Scripture reading, fasting, and quiet reflection on your spiritual journey.

But most of all, I invite you to throw your arms around the Savior's neck and hang on for dear life.
