This annual gathering brings together members and pastors not just to transact the business we do together in our Region (the state of Ohio) and our five mission districts (North West, North East, Southeast. North Central, and Southwest Ohio), but also is a time to worship together, fellowship together, learn together, pray together, and plan together.

This year the focus of **Mission Event on Friday**, **May 3 from 1:00-5:00 p.m.** will be on **Senior Adult Ministry**, from ministering to seniors and their families to empowering senior adults to share the Gospel of Jesus with others.

Our keynote speaker will be **Pastor Brad Hales**, pastor of Reformation Lutheran Church in Culpepper, Virginia. On Friday, May 3, he'll provide practical advice based on his experiences. There will be a Q-and-A session and an opportunity to brainstorm, share, and pray with others from throughout Ohio.

On Saturday, May 4 from 9:00- 5:00, we'll focus on Evangelism and Church Planting, hear reports from the North American Lutheran Church, our region, and our districts, and elect members of our district and regional executive councils. The concert will take place in the St. John's Sanctuary, 3220 Columbus Street, Grove City at 4:00pm on Sunday, April 7. This event is open to the public and all are invited. JOHN'S HISTORY COLUMN: This week's question was: What was the name of the brickyard located behind the present church, and was the house at the corner of Dudley and Columbus Street made from bricks from the brickyard? The question was asked by member Jim Jones. The bricks used in the construction of the present-day church were fired in the old brickyard, which was located behind St. John's. The name of the brickyard was Grove City Brick and Tile Factory, and it was owned or managed by a man named Edward Darnell. The house on the corner of Dudley and Columbus Street was also made from bricks from the brickyard behind St. John's.
