

#### Hello!



My name is Pam Wittenberg and I have taken over the coordination of the Raise Right fundraising program for our Youth Department. I will be coordinating the on-line portion of the program and working with Christina Allman for the overall coordination of Raise Right. My husband and I have had 2 daughters grow up in the St John's Youth Program and have firsthand knowledge of the wonderful faith-based values our church staff help to grow in the youth of our congregation. I previously coordinated this program for the GCHS Band program for several years, so I know how beneficial this program can be financially for our youth programs.

Raise Right has grown and changed over the years. There are now multiple ways in which you are able to support the Church using this program:

- 1) **Traditional Gift Cards**: you can continue to Order gift cards, both physical and on-line/electronic cards. Each card provides a "rebate" of the purchase amount back to the church as profit. Once you order your cards, some cards can be registered on your account or "in your wallet" and then be reloaded, so you don't have to get a new card each time. I personal have done this for years with Meijer, Starbucks, Panera, Walmart, etc. There are over 800 retailers available to choose from.
- 2) **Reload Gift Cards**: Simply reload previously purchased gift cards. You must use a gift card originally purchased from Raise Right. This enables you to add amounts that you typically couldn't purchase a regular card for. For example: You purchase a \$25.00 Meijer gift card and register it on your Raise right profile/wallet. The next time you want to place an order, you can add anywhere from \$1.00-\$500.00 to this card. The money will show up on your card as soon as the monthly church order is released-currently this is on the first Tuesday of every month.
- 3) Local Dining Options: This is a new program for Raise Right. In this program, you will need to have the Raise Right app downloaded on your phone. The program requires you to register a credit or debit card and link it to the Local Dining Fundraising Option. When you are ready to go out to eat, you can search for participating restaurants in your area. Simply use your credit card to pay for your meal and 5% of your total purchase will be rebated back to St. John's. I have not personally done this program yet, however on the Raise Right website, there is an instructional video that explains the program.

1) On-Line Shopping Program: This is also a newer way to fund raise through Raise Right. In this program you shop on-line at retailers from the Raise Right website. You select on-line shopping and Raise right provides a list of participating retailers. Percentages of your purchases come back to the church. There are over 550 brands. My understanding is that you will need to use a credit card this is connected to Raise Right, however I have not personally participated in this program.

Getting started in the Raise Right Program is simple and easy:

- 1) Go to the Raise Right website: <a href="https://www.raiseright.com/">https://www.raiseright.com/</a>
- 2) Click sign in and sign in with your username and Password, or create these if this is your first time.
- 3) The organizational name is: St John's Lutheran; Enrollment code: F58BB68A25237
- 4) Once you have registered, if the program requests verification of your ability to participate in the program for St. Johns, please contact me directly and I will have to complete this for you in the evenings after I get home from work.
- 5) Place your order by the first Tuesday of every month by 4pm. Orders will be typically be "released" that evening
- 6) If you are not paying by credit card or direct payment to Raise Right electronically, write out your check made payable to St John's Lutheran or turn in cash payment. \*\*I do request that this payment be turned in before the orders are released if at all possible. If you are not able to do this, please contact me directly to discuss.

#### ST. JOHN'S NEW NORTH ENTRANCE CROSS DISPLAY



Letter from the Pastor

#### Sanctified in Truth

Dear Disciples of Jesus,

In the movie, "Beauty and the Beast", Beast discovers that Beauty loves him in all his ugliness. Only then does he himself become beautiful. Only when we understand how much God loves us in all our unloveliness can we ourselves begin to become lovely... and godly. The biblical term for this process is called *sanctification*, and it has three "tenses".

In the past, God declared you and me holy because of Jesus' death on the cross. In this regard, we're like a lump of clay that's been purchased by a potter. In the future, all believers will be completely perfected by Christ when he comes again (someday we will become a flawless vessel. But in the meantime - in the present - Jesus asks his Father to conform us to his image (by molding us on his potters' wheel).

We are shaped "by the truth", Jesus says. Sadly, truth has fallen on hard times, so most people simply do what is right in their own eyes, and say, "This is MY truth." Yet biblically, truth is not a concept you can agree or disagree with. Truth is a *person* that you must either accept or reject. Truth is Jesus, the incarnate Word of God. And we come to know Him through the written Truth of revelation, and the proclaimed Truth of preaching. According to Jesus, this is how God works sanctification in those who believe:

"You are already **clean** because of the **word** I have spoken to you. (John 15:3)

"If you **hold to my teaching**, you are really my disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the **truth** will set you free." (John 8:31-32)

As we celebrate the freedoms we have in this country today, may we understand that there is only one way to be truly free. Sanctification is God's work, by the truth of his Word, through the power of the Holy Spirit. So how is the Spirit convicting you of sin today? Are you yielding to the ongoing spirit of repentance and humility that God wants to work into your life? Or resisting? As the Lord shapes and transforms you by his Word, what lies of the evil one are being exposed? What deceitfulness of heart? The Word of truth conforms our thoughts to God's thoughts, and our feelings to his feelings, empowering us to love him with engaged minds and soft hearts. About this ongoing process called sanctification, the reformer Martin Luther observed:

"This life, therefore, is not righteousness, but growth in righteousness, not health, but healing, not being but becoming, not rest but exercise. We are not yet what we shall be, but we are growing toward it, the process is not yet finished, but it is going on, this is not the end, but it is the road. All does not yet gleam in glory, but all is being purified."

And so we sing,

My faith looks up to Thee, Thou Lamb of Calvary, Savior divine! Now hear me while I pray; Take all my guilt away; O let me from this day Be wholly Thine.
