<u>BIBLE PASSAGES AND QUESTIONS TO PONDER</u>: Hello All! To deepen your walk with Christ, please consider reading these passages and pondering the questions before next Sunday. These will be our lectionary readings for Sunday, December 7.

#### Monday, December 1

Take a moment to reflect on yesterday's readings, sermon, and service. What stood out to you? What is God calling you to as a result?

#### Tuesday, December 2 – Reading: Isaiah 11:1-10

- The shoot is referring to a specific person. Who do you think this shoot is?
- What does it mean that the Spirit of the Lord will rest upon Him?

#### Wednesday, December 3 – Reading: Psalm 72

• This Psalm speaks of Jesus caring for and rescuing the poor and afflicted. How can we do the same for those around us?

#### Thursday, December 4 – Reading: Romans 15:4-13

What about Jesus brings you the most hope?

### Friday, December 5 – Reading: Matthew 3:1-2

• The word "repent" means "to completely turn away from". It's like you're facing the blaring sun, and you repent, by turning away from it so that it no longer blinds you. We are to repent from our sins (things we do wrong) and are to follow Jesus. Pray about what you may need to turn away from, and then ask Jesus for the strength to do so.

#### Saturday, December 6

Take a moment to pray for our services tomorrow and for the world during this season of Advent. Heavenly Father, as we await the coming of Jesus to rule and to reign, we ask that you soften the hearts of all around the world that all would come to know you and love you. In this season of joy and busy-ness, please grant our pastors, our staff, and our vicar words of wisdom. Give us open hearts and open minds to hear your Word and to make any changes to which You call us. In Jesus' Name, *Amen*.
