What a blessing it is to start a new year being surrounded by the love of this church! I pray that this has been a blessed Christmas season for everyone.

As I sit at my desk today, I can't help but think about New Year's Resolutions. It's the time of year when everyone seems to think, "New Year—New Start", and it's the time when most make a vow to be healthier in the year to come.

Some will join the gym, and each year as I see the gym flooded with new people in January and February, I pray that this will be a lasting life change. Some will vow to quit vaping or smoking, or vow to clean the house each week, or maybe even vow to be kinder and read their Bible every day. ## Letter from the Pastor

*"Because of the Lord's great love, we are not consumed, for His compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is Your faithfulness." (Lamentations 3:22-23)*

Dear Disciples of Jesus,

As we stand at the threshold of a new year, I'm reminded of the beautiful truth found in the above text from Lamentations. Each new year—and indeed, every single day is a gift of God's grace. It's a chance to begin again, to recommit, and to draw closer to Him. Whatever challenges or triumphs we experienced last year, we can bring them all before the Lord, knowing that His mercies are fresh and abundant for us today.

As your pastor, I encourage you to take time this week to reflect on two simple questions:
